ETHICSWEB Work Package 2, Task 6

by EKUT-IZEW and INSERM as of 27th February 2009



1 Introduction

According to the Description of Work of ETHICSWEB, task 6 of work package 2 has the objective to integrate portals and databases on ethics related research projects in the aimed portal management system ETHICSWEB. To obtain this, it is necessary to identify the relevant databases and information systems and to identify lacks of missing internet resources. In a further step, the providers of the identified resources ought to be contacted in order to find out, whether and how they could get integrated in the envisaged ETHICSWEB portal. The task is divided in two parts. The first herewith presented version 1 of Deliverable D 2.3 covers the survey on identified databases and portals on ethics related research projects.

The task to identify research projects on ethics leads to the question who is supposed / has an interest to provide research projects online. It can be assumed that on the one hand organisations whose task is funding of ethical research would present their funded projects. On the other hand there will be national or other central information providers who aim to inform the research community of ongoing and finished projects. As many of the resources don't focus on ethics solely, it also is necessary to consider portals and databases with a wider scope, if at least ethics related research projects are supposed to be part of the collection.

In order to prepare version 2 of the deliverable, the next steps will include validating and contacting the identified resources for the purposes of the ETHICSWEB portal.

In the Appendix, the questionnaire sent to the Regional Observers is documented.



2 Compilation of the survey

The following table shows the compilation of the questionnaires which have been returned by the Regional Observers by 27th February 2009. The resources are sorted 1. by country, 2. by region, and 3. by type of provider.

Some editorial work has been done while compiling the questionnaires. In some cases, thumbnails of database interfaces and other comments have been added. Sometimes two resources deriving from the same institution have been merged in one table row. Research areas of the providers or databases are highlighted in yellow. The right column of the table has been added in order to characterize and estimate the resources by the following preliminary aspects:
